Many buildings in our town and many other counties have our family history attached to them just like RCSC. Later, my oldest brother Jim started his own business called Roth Masonry. To this day, long after he retired, he still gets calls wanting work done or from someone in the business needing his expert advice on a project.

As the youngest daughter and only sister, I am blessed to have such a wonderful family and now have an extended family at RCSC. I hope to see more of you after I retire. I will, however, continue to enjoy the wonderful meals you provide. Thanks for having me.

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## **The Health Tests Seniors Need**

#### BLOOD PRESSURE CHECK

One in every three adults has elevated blood pressureTrusted Source, which is known as hypertension. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) Trusted Source, 64 percent of men and 69 percent of women between the ages of 65 and 74 have high blood pressure.

#### **BLOOD TESTS FOR LIPIDS**

Healthy cholesterol and triglyceride levels decrease your risk of a heart attack or stroke. If test results show high levels of either, your doctor may recommend an improved diet, lifestyle changes, or medications to reduce them.

#### COLORECTAL CANCER EXAM

A colonoscopy is a test where a doctor uses a camera to scan your colon for cancerous polyps. A polyp is an abnormal growth of tissue.

After the age of 50, you should get a colonoscopyTrusted Source every 10 years. And you should get them more frequently if polyps are found, or if you have a family history of colorectal cancer. A digital rectal exam can be performed to check for any masses in the anal canal.

#### VACCINATIONS

Get a tetanus booster every 10 years. And the CDCTrusted Source recommends a yearly flu shot for everyone, especially for those who are chronically ill.

At age 65, ask your doctor about a pneumococcal vaccine to protect against pneumonia and other infections. Pneumococcal disease can result in a number of health issues, including:

- pneumonia
- sinusitis
- meningitis
- endocarditis
- pericarditis
- inner ear infections

Everyone over age 60 also should be vaccinated against shingles.

#### EYEEXAM

The American Academy of Ophthalmology suggests adults get a baseline screening at age 40. Your eye doctor will then decide when follow-ups are needed. This may mean annual vision screenings if you wear contacts or glasses, and every other year if you don't.

Age also increases the chances for eye diseases like glaucoma or cataracts and new or worsening vision problems.

#### PERIODONTAL EXAM

Oral health becomes more important as you age. Many older Americans also may take medications that can have a negative effect on dental health. These medications include:

- antihistamines
- diuretics
- antidepressants

Dental issues may lead to loss of natural teeth. Your dentist should perform a periodontal exam during one of your twiceyearly cleanings. Your dentist will X-ray your jaw and inspect your mouth, teeth, gums, and throat for signs of problems.

#### HEARING TEST


Hearing loss is often a natural part of aging. Sometimes it can be caused by an infection or other medical condition. Every two to three years you should get an audiogram.

An audiogram checks your hearing at a variety of pitches and intensity levels. Most hearing loss is treatable, although treatment options depend on the cause and seriousness of your hearing loss.

#### DIABETES TEST

According to the American Diabetes Association, 29.1 million Americans had type 2 diabetes in 2012. Everyone should be screened beginning at age 45 for the condition. This is done with a fasting blood sugar test or a A1C blood test.

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### Two Dogs and a Parrot-What Our Animal Friends Can Teach Us About Life by Joan Chittister Joan Chittister is a leading inspirational writer with her book The Gift of Years on the best seller list.

Two Dogs and a Parrot are stories of her pets Danny, the Irish Setter, Duffy, the Golden Retriever and Lady the Caique Parrot. Each of the stories of their antics or peculiar ways to approach life and it's challenges is followed by a reflection meant for us to think about our own roles in life. Chittister challenges us to see ourselves as a part of nature and not just consumers of it. Our relationships with both animals and people can be brought to greater depth thru these readings. This is a very heartwarming, thought-provoking book. Two thumbs up.

#### Anything I Can Do by Mary Carson

This is a second book written by Mary (Trochlil) Carson, and it is every bit as much fun as her first book titled Anything That You Want.

Jasmine, a girl from the city meets Quinn, a country boy. Neither of them has ever considered living a different type of life. Jasmine is getting a great deal of pressure to leave her job as a Nurse Manager for Labor and Delivery at Merit Memorial Hospital in order to join Chandran Medical, a family owned research group. Quinn is pouring his heart and soul into trying to save the farm his family has owned for three generations. Following his father's death, the farm incurred large debts from bank loans. The bank is now demanding payment of \$250,000 or sale of part or all, of the farm.

Listed as "A Sweet Romantic Comedy" it is all that. The characters are well developed, likeable and reading the book leaves you with a happy feeling. Two thumbs up

#### Hidden (Lost and Found, #1) by Fern Michaels

This is a mystery and love story rolled into one. Siblings Cullen and Luna Bodman have opened a furniture restoration shop and café' in an up-and-coming arts center. Luna is a bohemian free spirit and Cullen is efficient and serious. Cullen has just purchased a truckload of furniture from the estate of a very rich individual named Mr. Millstone. Inside the buffet, in this collection, is Millstone's new final will that had been misplaced. Relatives of Mr. Millstone want the new will destroyed because they were disinherited for stealing from the family business. Tied up in a bow at the end of the story the son and daughter-in-law of Mr. Millstone are brought to justice, and several of the characters find love. Reviews were all over the place for this fun to read, but rather unexpected story. Thumbs up.

#### Secrets (Lost and Found #2) by Fern Michaels

When a mysterious trunk is dropped off at Cullen Bodman's restoration shop with a \$1,000 money order asking him to restore it, his sister, Luna, is drawn to the mystery of the smoky smelling trunk. When Luna finds a diary inside, she is determined to find the owner. Luna does readings for people and she senses that a new client she has, somehow has a connection to this trunk. This woman is 38 years old, pregnant, but unsure whether her marriage is still viable. Another part of the story finds a fellow shop owner seeking out a friendship that has been lost for 20 years. This is not a typical "mystery" story, but one of many twists and turns with a resolution of a number of relationships and the mystery of the trunk revealed. Mixed reviews, but a fun read given a thumbs up by our reader.

#### Victoria Emerson Series by John Gilstrap

Victoria Emerson is a West Virginia Congresswoman and is the last hope for our nation after its fall in a nuclear war. The government has been destroyed, the land is largely uninhabitable, electronics are useless, food is scarce and millions are ailing, scared and looking for aid from a government that can't seem to regroup.

The three books in this series are set after America's fall. All three are thrilling, heart racing, explosive stories causing us to question what would happen to us and to our country should nuclear war break out. Crimson Phoenix, is the first book and it was released in 2021. Blue Fire, the second novel was released in 2022. Much of the action takes place in Ortho, WV. A group of National Guardsmen are trying to secure the town and its resources for themselves. In White Smoke, just released this year, Victoria is asked to leave Ortho, which she and others have defended, to try to organize the government and establish a new rule of law.

These are well paced, well told stories best read in order. Our reader started with the second book, but plans to read the other two. Two thumbs up and great reviews for this series.

#### The Ultimate Betrayal (Maximum Security #3) by Kat Martin

Colonel Keegan has been accused of espionage and treason. His daughter, Jessica Keegan, a journalist, searches for the truth especially after her father is found dead of a heart attack. Jessica is sure he was murdered and sets about with Brandon Garrett, a bodyguard, to prove her father's innocence. This is an exciting, fast paced novel with great characters. Two thumbs up.

#### Beach House Summer by Sarah Morgan

Joanna Whitman has been divorced from celebrity chef Cliff Whitman for over a year. Cliff was a serial cheater and the news media often dragged Joanna back into the spotlight. Cliff is killed in a car accident, but surviving that crash was a young pregnant woman named Ashley. Joanna goes to the hospital and offers to take Ashley with her to the beach house in her hometown so that both can escape the media.

Joanna has been gone from her hometown for twenty years and is unsure of the reception she will have coming back. She suspects people will leave her be, but is surprised by the amount of acceptance and offers of help.

This is a great beach read, a wonderful story leaving you feel engaged in the character's lives and feeling good as the book draws to a close. Two thumbs up.

#### The Last House on the Street by Diane Chamberlain

This dual timeline story is set in 1965 and 2010 in North Carolina. Much to her family's dismay and disapproval Ellie Hockley, a college student, takes part in the SCOPE project, an effort to register black families to vote in the 1960's. 

What are Preventive & Wellness (P&W) services you may ask?

Well, they can be procedures, counseling or tests or labs that are requested by your doctor to a ensure on going good health or a service that helps prevent a condition from worsening.

What kind of tests are we talking about? Well, there are many and each of them and each of them have timeframes of eligibility. Here are some P&W services:

- Welcome to Medicare Wellness visit.
- Annual Wellness Visit
- Prostate cancer screening
- Mammograms
- Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm screening
- Lung Cancer Screening
- Alcohol misuse screening & counseling Flu Shots
- Bone Mass Measurements
- Glaucoma tests
- Cardiovascular disease screening
- Depression screening
- Cardiovascular Behavioral Therapy



Here is an example of a P&W service: (But this one has a twist.)

Colonoscopy is a covered Preventive & Wellness(P&W) service if you do not have a diagnosis regarding the colon. Things to remember 1- if you do have a diagnosis pertaining to your colon and the doctor orders a colonoscopy that would be labeled "Medically Necessary" 2- no previous diagnosis and doctor requests Colonoscopy that would be "Preventive & Wellness" and assuming nothing was found. 3- if during the Preventive Colonoscopy they do find something, and doctor removes a polyp to be lab tested, at that moment your procedures has gone from Preventive & Wellness to a Diagnostic service. And depending on the insurance(s) you have a deductible might be due when you wake up.



#### Getting to Know CRT: Partnerships

Did you know that Country Roads Transit has partnerships with multiple community agencies within both Randolph and Upshur Counties? One example is our partnership with the Randolph County Housing Authority that manages the Youth Build Program.

The goal of Youth Build is to give young adults the tools to get a good job and keep it. Youth Build works to develop the capacity of young adults to be responsible members of their families and communities by strengthening educational backgrounds, teaching marketable skills and entrepreneurship, and instilling leadership values that relate to home, work and community.

Country Roads Transit provides transportation to the students enrolled in this program. On a daily basis, Country Roads Transit Transports Youth Build students from their homes to the classroom and also provides transportation to the students for their charity work within the Elkins community such as Catholic Charities and the Randolph County Humane Society.
